Live Your Life Well is a national public education campaign designed by MHA to help people better manage stress. It offers the following 10 tools to live your life well:

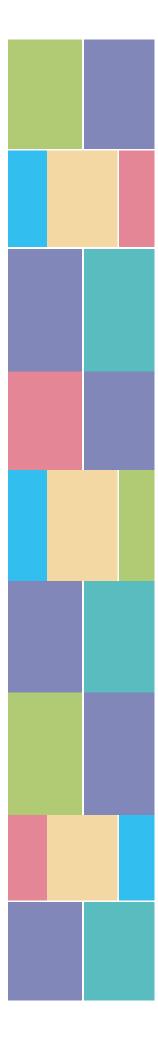
- Connect with others.

Spotlighting a MHAJC Program:

Mental Health America has provided suicide prevention information at Seymour Senior High School and this year prepared packets of information for Crothersville. Brownstown, and Medora high school personnel. Why? Because suicide among teens often occurs following a stressful life event, such as a perceived failure at school, a breakup with a boyfriend or girlfriend, the death of a loved one, a divorce, or a major family conflict. Most teens show some warning signs so that is why we targeted the high school teachers, the ones who spend the greatest amount of time daily with our teenagers. The pressures that teens feel today is overwhelming and if we can assist the community in helping combat the possibility of teen suicide, then we are here for them! The national Suicide Crisis lines are 1-800-784-2433 and 1-800-273-8255; always someone there to listen to troubled teens!
